# For all foreign residents in Japan: Important Health Warning

Recently there are many people who were already infected with tuberculosis, and then the symptoms of the disease appeared after they came to Japan.

## What kind of disease is tuberculosis?

Tuberculosis is a contagious disease of the lungs and other organs. It can be cured by taking medicine every day, but if the symptoms get worse, the infection can spread.

It is important to notice it early to protect yourself and the people around you.



### Watch out for symptoms like these!

- Cough and/or phlegm lasting 2 weeks or longer
  - Long-lasting slight fever



Feeling tired and sluggish



Losing weight

#### Tuberculosis can be detected by a chest X-ray, or by testing your phlegm.



## Take care of these things to keep living healthy

#### When you are feeling well

- Eat well, sleep well, and keep a consistent "rhythm" or schedule in your daily life.
- ② Get a health checkup from a doctor once a year.

And if a problem is found, be sure to go to the hospital.

#### When you are feeling unwell

- Please go to a hospital nearby, as soon as possible.
